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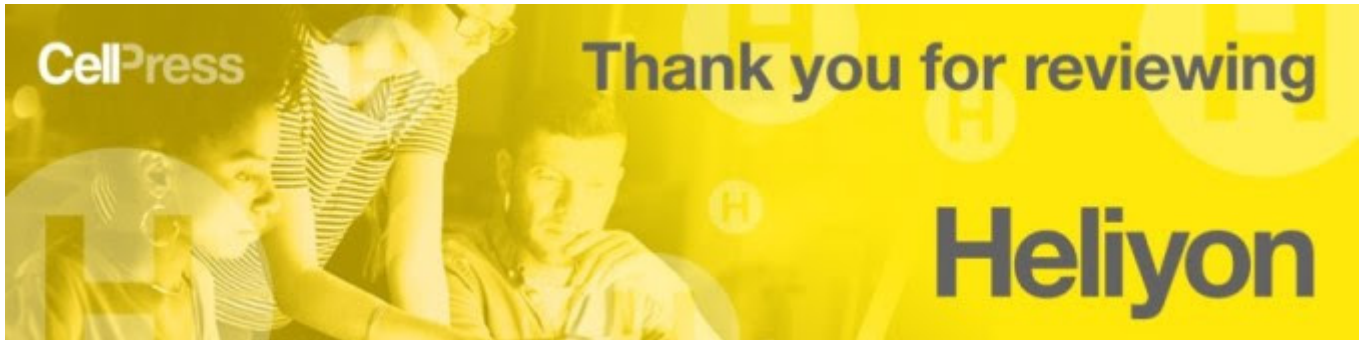

Reviewer #1: 1. The article still needs professional proofreading. In the abstract, for example, there are still grammar and punctuation problems. Such as "gayonese" that should be written with a capital "G" since it is the name of one of the languages spoken in Aceh.

2. In the Introduction, the aim of the research should be clearly presented by the end of this section. It would be sounder if the author(s) provide the research question(s) for this research paper. The gap of study is missing; what is the novelty of this research? Any previous related studies?

3. The Literature Review section should be divided into sub-sections. Some explanation of "neighbouring languages" (such as claimed in the Abstract) of Gayonese, Jamee language, and Simeulu Island languages, and others (if any) should also be presented in this section because this is also a part of the findings of this research.

4. The Research Method is weak; there are a lot of missing information in this section. The author(s) claimed that data were obtained from: "native speakers of each of the dialect backgrounds". How many speakers from each dialect? What dialects? What were the criteria of the speakers (i.e. age, background?). Next, "a pre-prepared list of 285 loanwords"; from whose theory(ies)/expert(s) was this list constructed from? What do you mean by "analysed using auditory technique"? I would prefer looking at this section divided into subsections, such as: Design, Participants, Instruments, Data Collection and Data Analysis.

5. The Results section is divided into a few sub-sections/themes. I would use this to formulate the research question(s) for this research at the Introduction section. It would also be useful if the themes were also explained in the Method section; that the author(s) divided the findings based on the themes and that the themes are also based on experts' theories.

6. The Discussion section is weak; the author(s) only referred to two past studies. The discussion is where the author(s) delve into the meaning, importance and relevance of their results. It should focus on explaining and evaluating what they have found, showing how it relates to the literature review and research questions, and making an argument in support of their overall conclusion.

7. In Conclusion, the statement "Undoubtedly, the Indonesian loanwords considered in this study came into the Acehnese language at a time before the 2004 tsunami and cessation of the war of independence waged by the Free Aceh Movement (GAM), when the Acehnese language was dominant" should be discussed in the Discussion section. It is not the conclusion of this research. The limitations and recommendations for future related research should also be presented in this section. The author(s) need to re-write this section.

Reviewer #2: Methods: The method used is relevant to see, however it seems that the authors do not acknowledge the consent from the research participants.

Results: The research results provide enough data to address the problem raised. However, it is better if the authors clearly mentions the gaps existing in the previous studies on the loanwords of Indonesian language into Acehese language studies.

Interpretation: This is well said.

Other comments: This article should have stated that this study has filled in the gap; however, its limitation exists that requires further explorations.

Reviewer #3: This is an interesting topic and a potential paper under topics of phonetics phonology. It has contribution to knowledge and community especially in Acehese context.
